

# BRINGING TO REMEMBRANCE

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Why did God tell us to remember? The Lord God remembers everything; and praise His Holy Name there are things He remembers NO MORE! Christ remembers; and we are to remember the Great Work of Salvation that was wrought for us and in us. Purposed by God – orchestrated by, in and through Christ.

Remember Lots wife.  
Stirring one another up by way of remembrance  
Remembering the words of Jesus  
Exhorted to remember the words which were spoken by the apostles.  
Remembering the words of our Savior; I will never leave thee nor forsake thee.  
Remember the adversary goes about as a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour  
Remember he is the father of all lies; and set on destroying YOU  
Remember greater is He that is in you, than he that is in the world  
Remember God is our Hiding place  
Remember He is our strength and joy  
Remember being a friend to the world is the enemy of God.  
Remember our Savior, He laid down His life that we might live.  
Remember that His selfless act gave you redemption, justification, sanctification, and reconciliation.

The Greatest Remembrance that demands our life's devotion is that of the Lord's Table. His body broken and His blood shed. Jesus said: For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup; ye do show the Lord's death till He come. I Cor.11:24,25.
